Message from the CEO

Each spring we invite our members to complete a survey administered by Boys & Girls Clubs of America called the National Youth Outcome Initiative (NYOI). This survey measures our impact on the lives of the youth we serve and allows us to track our own progress and perhaps most importantly, compare kids who attend Club against kids who do not in the five key areas: safe, positive environment; sense of belonging; supportive relationships; opportunities and expectations; and recognition.

The data for the 2023 survey is in and we were really thrilled to see that 90% our members feel the Club is an emotionally safe place for them, 80% have a connection to a staff member, 86% have done something to make a difference in their community, and 92% are abstaining from drug use. We were not surprised that the survey data also shows kids are struggling to connect with their peers, resolve conflicts and cope with challenges in their day to day lives.

As we transition away from extended day summer programming into afterschool programs in our Clubs and for our school age youth in our early learning centers, with your continued commitment, we will most certainly focus our efforts on the areas where our youth are telling us, through this survey, that they need help. Our desire and ability to meet the needs of our kids makes us unique. We are thankful to our community of supporters for investing in the youth we serve.

Our newest initiative is a workforce readiness program for teens called Spark My Future. Named by our local teens attending the Club, the curriculum is composed of three Boys & Girls Clubs of America developed programs. CareerLaunch focuses on preparing youth for internships, first jobs, and ongoing skill acquisition. Money Matters, a financial literacy program, seeks to promote financial responsibility and independence for the future. Road Code teaches safe driving techniques and principles through driving simulation headsets.









The teens recently visited CTK's Food Share and Farm as part of Workforce Wednesday, a weekly program that introduces members to various career opportunities. We learned how to harvest and prepare various vegetables to

go out into the community, and gained a better understanding of the work that goes into the food that we consume. CTK also donated cabbage, tomatoes, and carrots for our healthy food program. These veggies went into multiple lunches for our summer camp program.
